Introduction

- A Holter monitoring is a continuous tape recording of a patient's ECG for at least 24 hours.
- It can be performed with your usual daily activities; the results help the physician correlate symptoms of dizziness, palpitations or black outs.

• Holter recording covers 24 hours, on a continuous basis, it is much more likely to detect an abnormal heart rhythm when compared to a resting ECG which records rhythm in less than a minute.

Preparation

- 1. Please wear loose-fitting clothes so as to minimize interfering with the electrodes and ECG recording.
- 2. Please have a bath prior the procedure because showering or bathing is not allowed during the test.

Process

- 1. Clean your chest with skin prep-gel to ensure good attachment of the sticky ECG electrodes.
- 2. Shaving of hairy chest may be needed prior to the attachment of the electrodes.
- 3. ECG electrodes are placed on your chest wall and connected to the holter recorder.
- 4. The recorder is secured to your belt, or it can be slung over the shoulder and neck with the use of carrying pouch.
- 5. You are allowed to perform your usual daily activities.

- 6. To avoid getting the setup wet and damaging the recorder, showering and bathing is not allowed.
- 7. A diary is provided so that you can record any abnormal activities and symptoms (skipped heartbeats, chest discomfort, dizziness, etc.) together at the occurring time, and you also need to press down the record button of the Holter monitor at the same time.
- 8. The Holter monitor and the patient diary need to be returned to our centre at the end of the evaluation time.
- 9. It takes approximately 10 to 15 minutes to apply and few minutes to remove the monitor.

Risks

- Holter monitoring is an extremely safe procedure.
